

From Pastor Steve. . . .

Advent? It isn't even Thanksgiving yet! Yes, it is early in the season to be talking about Advent (the 4 weeks before Christmas) yet the stores have all made the jump from Halloween to Christmas and they are giving us one very succinct message about what Christmas is all about, "SPEND, BUY, SPEND!"



I am going to invite us to do something a bit radical this Advent, join a conspiracy movement. Thousands of churches around the world are joining this movement, this conspiracy. They are inviting followers of Jesus to do just that, follow Jesus. The conspiracy is broken down into four ways to follow Jesus:

Worship Fully, Spend Less, Give More and Love All.

Worship Fully: Let this be a season in which we all put down our burdens and lift our attention to our God. Entering the story of advent means entering this season with a renewed passion to worship the One who has revealed to us the true and living way. Directing our attention to God in prayer and by hearing the proclamation of the gospel shapes who we are and what we do with the gift of our lives.

Spend Less: What was the one gift you remember getting for Christmas last year? Next question: What about the fourth gift? Do you remember that one? Many of us don't because it wasn't something we necessarily wanted or needed. Spending Less isn't a call to stop giving gifts; it's a call to stop spending money on gifts we won't remember in less than a year. America spends around \$600 billion dollars during the Christmas season, and much of that is joyless and goes right onto a credit card. By spending wisely on gifts we free ourselves from the anxiety associated with debt so we can take in the season with a full heart.

Give More: We know what you're thinking. "Wait, didn't they just say I should spend less, and yet here they are telling me to give more? What gives?" The most powerful, memorable gift you can give to someone else is yourself. And nobody modeled this more than Jesus. So what does this look like for you? Tickets to a ball game or the theater? A movie night? The main point is simple: When it comes to spending time with those you love, it's all about quality, not quantity.

Love All: It all boils down to love. Love from a savior. Love to a neighbor in need. By spending just a little less on gifts we free up our resources to love as Jesus loves by giving to those who really need help. This is the conspiracy three churches began a few years ago, and has since grown to an international movement where thousands of churches have raised millions of dollars to love others in life changing ways. It's not that there's something wrong with the shopping mall—it's that the better story is about loving all. So will you join me in the next month as we prepare for Advent to do some conspiring? Will you join me in following Jesus in this season when there is so much pressure to do many things which seem quite contrary to Jesus' message.

The garden was very successful again this summer, with help from a lot of sunshine and rain. We received \$250 from Thrivent Financial to purchase seeds, plants, and canning supplies. We gathered 579 pounds of produce that was given to the Jordan Area Food Shelf, the Schule Haus, and was sold to the congregation after worship. The money from these sales was split between Families Moving Forward and paper products for the Jordan Area Food Shelf. We also made 66 pints of salsa, 55 pints of tomato soup, 28 pints of bread & butter pickles, and 5 pints of cucumber relish. The sales from these canned goods also went to the above mentioned. 



Operation Christmas Child Packing Party Donations Needed



The 10th Annual Operation Christmas Child (OCC) shoe box packing party is on Sunday, November 12 at 10:15 a.m. This is a family event - adults must stay with their children. Kids of the Kingdom children will share the love of Jesus with those in need and pack shoeboxes full of small gifts that will be shipped to children in impoverished and war-stricken regions throughout the world.

This program makes a difference. Here's a story shared on OCC's Facebook page:

"Ten-year-old Betty was visiting her cousin for a week when she was invited to a shoebox distribution. When she received a gift box that day, she began crying openly. When volunteers asked her why she was crying, she said she could not believe all the items in the box belonged to her. She shared that she missed school for a week because she did not have a pencil to use. Now, she will be able to return to school because she received pencils in her box."

How can you help?

Donate needed items to reach our goal of 100 shoeboxes. All items should be new and unused. A collection box is located in the narthex.

We need:

- 50 small, non-violent toys
- 75 boxes of markers, crayons and/or colored pencils
- 25 SMALL pads of paper (small legal pads work best)
- 25 washcloths
- 66 bars of soap
- 50 girl's t-shirts (sz XS, S, M, L)
- 50 boy's t-shirts (sz XS, S, M, L)
- 10 boy's socks (size S, fit ages 2-4)
- 15 boy's socks (size M, shoe size 10 - 2)
- 10 boy's socks (size L, shoe size 3 - 9)
- 10 girl's socks (size S, fits ages 2 - 4)
- 15 girl's socks (size M, 10 - 2)
- 15 girl's socks (size L, 3 - 9)

This is a gentle reminder to every member who has not already done so to fill out and submit your intention of giving cards. If your card has been lost in the shuffle you can call or stop by the church office (952-492-2099) to indicate your intention. We hope to have everyone indicate some kind of intention of giving. If it's not possible for you to increase your giving at this time it would still be helpful to receive your intention card so that we know how to plan.

At the conclusion of the campaign on November 5th we will try to follow up with everyone who has not yet indicated an intention. It is important that everyone has the opportunity to participate at some level. Again, the results so far are encouraging. We are confident that when all the responses are in that we will be able to plan a church budget that allows us to continue to do all of the mission that God intends in spite of the loss of rental income. It may even be that we will be able to expand the good work to which we are called.
