From Pastor Steve. . .

UNEXPECTED AND MYSTERIOUS

The Christian season of Christmas actually begins on Christmas Eve and lasts for twelve days, ending on January 6. (No, the twelve-day season of Christmas did not start with the song. It was the other way around.) The time before Christmas is Advent, a season of preparation for

Christmas. Christians prepare for celebrating the birth of Jesus by remembering the longing of the Jews for a Messiah. In Advent, we're reminded of how much we ourselves also need a Savior, and we look forward to our Savior's second coming even as we prepare to celebrate his first coming at Christmas. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word adventus, which means "coming" or "visit." In the season with this name, we keep in mind both "advents" of Christ, the first in Bethlehem and the second yet to come.

There is another advent transformational experience of the birth of Jesus within us in the present time.

O Holy child of Bethlehem descend to us we pray Cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us TODAY. We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; Oh, come to us, abide with us, our Lord Immanuel.

As we deliberately consider the advent of Jesus we listen to the promise that God's peace and justice will fill the earth. There will be no more sorrow or tears. People will turn implements of war into tools to produce food, and "nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more" (Isaiah 2:4). It's easy for those of us who live in safety, comfort, and prosperity to neglect a godly hope for the coming of the kingdom and all of its benefits. Yet, this hope can be inflamed within us when we reach out to share life with and care for people in need, for the hungry and homeless, for victims of injustice and oppression, for those who suffer from sickness or sadness. Advent can be a time to touch those in need, not only so that we might share God's love with them, but also so that our yearning for the kingdom might be renewed within us.

I love to sing the lovely Advent hymn "Unexpected and Mysterious" with its reminder that while we wait for the Savior's coming we can embody God's compassion for each fragile human life. The advent of Christ happens in us and through us – the very body of Christ. It happened, it will happen, and it's happening now!

UNEXPECTED AND MYSTERIOUS (E.L.W. # 258)

Unexpected and mysterious is the gentle word of grace Ever loving and sustaining is the peace of God's embrace. If we falter in our courage and we doubt what we have known, God is faithful to console us as a mother tends her own. In a momentary meeting of eternity and time Mary learned that she would carry both the mortal and divine. Then she learned of God's compassion, of Elizabeth's great joy, and she ran to greet the woman who would recognize her boy. We are called to ponder myst'ry and await the coming Christ, To embody God's compassion for each fragile human life, God is with us in our longing to bring healing to the earth, While we watch with joy and wonder for the promised Savior's birth. *Jeannette M. Families Moving Forward...

Families Moving Forward: Ending homelessness one family at a time

Beacon's Families Moving Forward program offers families experiencing homelessness hospitality, emergency shelter and a path to home with support for stability.

How does the program operate?

Volunteers from about 80 congregations throughout the Twin Cities metro area create shelter space at congregation sites. In addition to a safe place to sleep and a warm meal, volunteers share kindness and compassion with families experiencing homelessness. Completing the circle of support, our professional staff work closely with each family to address their unique barriers to stability so they may leave our shelter program for permanent housing.

Where is it located? The Families Moving Forward-Hennepin Program Center is located at 1808 Emerson Avenue North, Minneapolis, 55411. The program manager is Sakinah Mujahid. Her phone number is 612-529-2185 x13. The Families Moving Forward-Southwest Program Center serving Carver and Scott counties is located at 145 Engler Blvd, Chaska, 55318 (lower level of Shepherd of the Hill Presbyterian Church). The phone number is 952-230-2930. The FMF-SW referral line is 952-767-0708, for families seeking shelter.


How many families do you serve? Our capacity is 12 families at a time, 8 at FMF-Hennepin and 4 at FMF-Southwest. Families are often referred to us by counties, another service agency, or even word of mouth. What is a day in our program like? Everyone has a routine, and families say that's really important to them. During the day families use the Program Centers as a hub. They include staff offices, storage space for personal belongings, a kitchen, laundry machines, computer access, a living room, children's play area and a quiet room. School buses pick up children for school or HeadStart here, and bring them back at the end of the day. Parents go to work, meet regularly with our staff, search for housing and jobs, meet for financial literacy class, do laundry, make meals and care for their children.

In the evenings, congregations take turns weekly to open their doors to welcome families, providing a safe place to sleep, hot meals, activities and friendship. We arrange for bus transportation from the Program Centers to hosting congregations each night, and the return trip in the morning. The night shelter program relies on the commitment and compassion of congregational volunteers.

Do you help families find homes? Yes, we know that shelter is a temporary solution. Families need homes where they can create stability and success so parents work with our staff advocates with the goal of securing stable housing within 60 days of arriving. We will support about 50 families this year to find a home.

Here at Hope Lutheran Church ~ We partner with St. John's to host Families Moving Forward four times a year. Our next hosting week is February 10-17, 2019. Watch for a signup-genius and you too can help in our hosting duties.

Launch Ministry is a faith-based non-profit organization for young adults between 18-29 years old. The Launch Ministry supports struggling and homeless youth and young adults at our <u>homeless drop-in resource center</u> and through outreach in schools and other locations in Carver and Scott County. This ministry has several other ways they help these youth:

=Provide access to housing programs by providing housing/homeless assessments to 18-25 year olds =Provide personal and household products, snacks, clothing and other supplies (as donated by the community) =Provide mentoring through various means, including formal mentoring relationships, our Adulting Game (goal setting to earn gas & gift cards), informal conversations with staff and volunteers

=Support Groups

- Tuesday: weekly free dinner followed by Bible Study or a Speaker
- Thursday: Celebrate Recovery includes free dinner
- 12-Step Groups

=Manage a scattered-site housing program (available only through the housing assessment)

- =Connect individuals with various resources throughout the area: housing, education, financial support, transportation, resources for children, etc.
- =Network with churches, government, businesses, and other service organizations to best serve young people in our area
