Monthly Meeting of Hope Lutheran Trustees - Sunday, June 14, 2026

Bethel's Rock Church:

Contract is for \$1,200/mo., May – August after which time we will evaluate and decide on extending. Sign-up for weekly building reps has been good. A number of issues have been brought to the tenant's attention and are being addressed. We plan to meet with Ivan of Bethel's Rock this week to further discuss. Trustees feel extending this agreement may not be in Hope Lutheran's best interests but will continue to evaluate. We will seek Council's opinion at their June meeting.

Security Cameras:

Access is now available all Trustees. Two cameras are currently off-line; playground and pop can trailer. John will work on it this month.

Refuse Bins: Angie is working with Kyle Narum at By-The-Yard. 2 compost bins, 1 for trash. Units are expected to be ready in June. Steve will investigate getting liners from the county.

Monthly checklist:

Upper window cleaning delayed to July 13 due to contractor scheduling issues. Angie will reach out to another local firm in the interim. Quote was \$515 for 79 windows that require a ladder to reach (inside and outside).

Lower window cleaning (spring cleanup) has not been completed but volunteers for most sections have been identified.

Quarterly statements of individual giving have been emailed to all members.

Old Business

ECOBEE thermostat app Resolved: Now working on Angie's phone, had to access S/N located on inside back of the thermostat.

Money Management: Resolved, now have CDs of \$50k & \$40k in general fund and \$43k in dedicated "NBT" fund

Parking Lot issues: Resolved: Separation of asphalt from pavers has closed on its own so no action is required.

Other:

Weed spray on 5-11 resulted in good kill. Plan to spray again in late summer.

Leaks in irrigation system have been repaired. Removed all broadcast sprinklers from the garden, added 2nd spigot near garden gate.

New Business:

1. Dispose of old sound board (see "Sound System" below) as well as Sarah's old computer and a failed vacuum. Will ask Clay to handle at his convenience.
2. Suggestion was made to find a better place to hang hearing assist devices, perhaps outside sanctuary near children's bags or in a special rack. John to consult with Tom Francis.

3. Bonding of officers and staff who have access to funds is a requirement in our old constitution that is not being followed. Further research has shown that while not required by Minnesota law, an Employee Dishonesty bond is recommended to protect church assets from theft, fraud and embezzlement. Trustees are seeking Council's guidance on this.
4. Lower branches of new Cathedral Elm trees in parking lot median have been trimmed as they were beginning to interfere with car doors. Growth season is the proper time for this.

Deferred Actions:

1. Sound System Improvements: Estimate in the \$7K-\$8K range. Action still pending.
Per Kyle Narum, we can dispose of old sound board.
2. Paver project final eval and approval is still pending. Issues with sealing the surface and repairing one paver with chipped corner. Doug to check with Rod Lieske for update and contractor contact info.
3. Resolved: Per Council in May, bulletin advertising will no longer be offered.
There is no replacement of the \$4K budgeted income.
